Warning For Town Meeting, 1892.

The legal voters of the town of Rutland are hereby warned to meet at the Town Hall in Rutland, on Tuesday, March first, A. D., 1892, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following matters:

1. To choose all necessary officers required by law.
2. To see if the Town will vote to raise money by tax or otherwise to pay all current expenses and the indebtedness of the Town.
3. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Sections 382 to 388 of the Revised laws and any amendments and additions thereto, providing for the payment of all taxes directly to the Town Treasurer.
4. To see at what time the several taxes voted by the Town shall be payable.
5. To see what compensation the Town will vote to Town Officers.
6. To see if the town will vote an appropriation for the support of Rutland Free Library during the ensuing year.
7. To see if the Town will vote a State School tax of ten cents on the dollar to comply with the requirements of law.
8. To see if the Town will vote an appropriation for the proper observance of Memorial day.
9. To see if the Town will vote to alter the boundaries of any School Districts in town, or the limits of any fractional or union districts.
10. To see if the Town will vote to provide means by special tax or otherwise to meet the balance of the State tax due June 10th.
11. To see what action the Town will take in regard to cutting down the hill at the junction of Wales Street and Strong Avenue and between Strong Avenue and Washington street.
12. To see if the Town will vote to widen State Street Bridge ten feet or more.
13. To see if the Town will instruct the selectmen to place electric lights on State Street Bridge and at the Dorr Bridge.
14. To see if the Town will vote to have Baxter Street or Cleveland Avenue extended southerly to West street by means of a tunnel under the railroad tracks,

15. To see if the Town will vote to build a foot bridge over the railroad tracks from near Franklin Street to the foot of Washington Street, and if so to provide means for the expense thereof.

16. To choose grand and petit jurors.

17. To see if the Town will vote to exempt the polls of freemen from taxation.

18. To see what if any exemption from taxation the town will vote to grant manufacturing establishments under the provisions of law.

19. To see what action the Town will take in regard to abating the nuisance arising from the filthy condition of Moon Brook in School District No. 1, caused by the emptying of the sewerage from the Village of Rutland.

20. To see if the Town will instruct the selectmen to provide suitable heating apparatus for Memorial Hall and Library and provide means for the expense thereof.

21. To see if the Town will vote to assist the Central Vermont Railroad Co. in building a new passenger depot, and vote a tax for the same.

22. To transact any other necessary and proper business.

The warning was then read by the Clerk, Charles B. Mann.

Two o'clock P. M. the meeting was called to order to act upon the articles in the warning.

ART. 2.—C. H. Granger moved that a tax of 45 cents on the dollar be voted, which motion was lost. Upon motion of J. D. Spellman the article was laid on the table.

ART. 3 and 4.—Upon motion of C. H. Granger it was voted to adopt the provisions of Sections 382 to 388 and to make taxes payable August 1.

ART. 5.—Upon motion, laid on the table.

ART. 6.—Upon motion of C. H. Granger the usual tax of 3 cents on the dollar was voted.

ART. 2.—C. H. Granger moved that a tax of 45 cents on the dollar be voted, which motion was lost. Upon motion of J. D. Spellman the article was laid on the table.

ART. 3 and 4.—Upon motion of C. H. Granger it was voted to adopt the provisions of Sections 382 to 388 and to make taxes payable August 1.

ART. 5.—Upon motion, laid on the table.

ART. 6.—Upon motion of C. H. Granger the usual tax of 3 cents on the dollar was voted.

ART. 7.—Upon motion of C. H. Granger, voted a tax of 10 cents on the dollar.

ART. 8.—Upon motion of T. H. Brown it was voted that \$100 be given to the G. A. R. for the purpose of observing Memorial day.

ART. 9.—Upon motion of T. W. Moloney was dismissed.

ART. 10.—Upon motion of C. H. Granger it was voted that a tax of 10 cents on the dollar be raised.

ART. 11.—The following resolution was, upon motion, adopted:

That the Board of Selectmen elected for the ensuing year be, and are

hereby instructed and directed, to cut down the highway on Wales Street, at the junction of Wales Street and Strong Avenue, and to work the same to a uniform grade from Washington Street to Strong Avenue.

ART. 12.—After some discussion, the following resolution, offered by T. H. Brown, was adopted:

Resolved, That the Selectmen are hereby authorized and directed to cause to be widened the bridge over East Creek on State Street, by moving the north truss to the northerly edge of said bridge, as it now stands, and by constructing a foot walk along the east side of said truss, when moved.

ART. 13.—Upon motion of J. A. Huffmire, it was voted that the Selectmen be instructed to put electric lights in Dorr and Billings bridges.

ART. 14.—Upon motion of J. D. Spellman, it was voted to refer the matter to the Selectmen to report at next meeting.

ART. 15.—After some discussion the following resolutions were adopted:

Resolved, That the Selectmen be, and are hereby empowered and directed, to build a foot bridge over the railroad tracks from a point near Franklin Street to a point near the foot of Washington Street, agreeable to the plan of the same as already drawn by Chappell & Burke, and that the same be paid for by a tax 10 cents on the dollar raised on the Grand List of the town this year, and which said tax it is hereby voted be raised for said purpose. Also resolved:

That in building the bridge voted under Article 15, the Selectmen shall, so far as practicable, give preference to Rutland manufacturers and Rutland workmen.

ART. 16.—Upon motion, was left with the Board of Civil Authority.

ART. 17.—Upon motion of C. H. Granger, voted, that the polls of firemen, as reported by the Clerk of the companies, be exempt from taxation.

ART. 18.—After some discussion, the following resolution presented by P. M. Meldon, was adopted:

Resolved, That the two mills erected by the Howe Scale Company of 1886 in the year 1891, together with the machinery used in operating the same, shall be exempt from taxation for the period of five years from the time of commencing to operate the same, in accordance with the statute in such case made and provided. Also the new shop of the Lincoln Iron Works.

ART. 19.—Upon motion of T. H. Brown it was voted to leave it with the Selectmen with power to act.

ART. 20.—Upon motion of T. W. Moloney it was voted to leave it with the Selectmen with instructions to act favorably.

ART. 21.—Upon motion of T. H. Brown, was dismissed.

ART. 22.—Upon motion, the following resolution, offered by T. W. Moloney, was adopted:

Resolved, That the fines and costs imposed upon Julia Lapine, Henry Bolduc and James Sage by Newman Weeks, Esq., Justice of the Peace, upon charges for keeping unlicensed dogs, which said fines and costs are payable to the Treasurer of the town, be, and the same hereby are remitted and discharged, and in case final process is issued for the collection of said fines and costs or either of them the Selectmen are hereby authorized to issue an order or orders upon the treasury to the person against whom such process is issued for the full amount of such fines and costs.

ART. 23.—Upon motion the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the Selectmen are hereby requested to employ no man at a less price than \$1.50 per day and that 9 hours constitute a days work, and that the pay be weekly.

Also resolved:

That the Selectmen be instructed to appeal to the next session of the Legislature that the right be granted to the Town of Rutland to fund and refund that portion of the present indebtedness of the town now bearing interest in excess of 4 per cent., and that the act, if passed, be presented at the next annual meeting for its adoption or rejection.

Upon motion of F. M. Butler it was then voted that the jurisdiction of the First Constable include the entire state.

The following organizations were given the free use of the Town Hall for the ensuing year:

Article 5 was then taken from the table, and upon motion of F. M. Butler there was voted a tax of 40 cents.

The meeting then adjourned, except as to the appointment of grand and petit jurors.

Selectmen's Report.

To the Taxpayers of the Town of Rutland:—

As the office of Selectmen, so far as it applies to the hitherto Town of Rutland is concerned, is this day abolished with the advent of a city government, and deeming it important that a full account of our stewardship should be rendered to the time of the expiration of our term of office, we have made this report for the term ending March 7, 1893, instead of for the year ending February 6, 1893, as would have been the case under the old order of things. This we thought the proper thing to do, both for the information of the citizens and taxpayers as well as for the benefit of the incoming city officials.

Orders have been drawn by this Board during their term of office on the General Fund from No. 620 to 961 inclusive. The list of those orders in their regular order, to whom and for what purpose drawn, may be found elsewhere in this report and should be examined. The amount so drawn is \$54,767.62, apportioned as follows:

WALES STREET HILL.

Acting under instructions of the last annual meeting we caused Wales street hill to be cut down very nearly to grade. Land damages were awarded to John Engrem and Louis Martel. To the former \$475 and to the latter \$400. All other property owners in the neighborhood waived damages. The expense of doing this work is more apparent than real for the reason that about \$600 of the amount of orders drawn should be charged to the account of Clover street.

CLOVER STREET.

The above named street runs from South Broadway east to South Main street, and was worked in connection with that of Wales street. No land damage was claimed by the property owners for the laying out of this street or lane (it being but 45 feet wide), and since the same was opened for travel two residences have been erected there and several lots sold, on which the owners intend to build the present season.

BRIDGES.

The amount expended for the repairs of the several bridges in town was \$2,152.22. The enlarging and rebuilding of the iron bridge on State street was the chief item, being more than three-fourths of the whole.

FREE LIBRARY.

The item of \$4,017.30 for the Rutland Free Library was simply the transferring of the sum voted and raised by the Town from the Town treasury to the Library Association.

INTEREST ON FUNDED DEBT.

Of the \$6,347.95 paid for interest on the funded debt, the sum of \$2,741.71 was for interest on the U. S. Surplus Fund, which was transferred to the School Fund.

STATE SCHOOL TAX.

There was no article in the warning for the Town meeting of 1892 to provide for the special State school tax of five cents, which was required to be paid by Act No. 6 of the Session Laws of 1890, and the amount due from Rutland, \$4,432.06, had to be paid by order on the Town treasurer.

STATE TAX.

Of the \$7,977.72 State tax paid nearly the whole amount was raised by the nine cent tax voted by the Town. For the convenience of the treasurer the order was drawn for the full amount.

TOWN LIQUOR AGENCY.

The amount of orders drawn for this department, as shown above and given in detail elsewhere in this report, is \$4,644.76. The amount of sales is shown in the agent's report, and as usual the result of said sales has been a profit to the Town. In December last James Russell's term of office expired, and the County Commissioner appointed Henry C. Tower, the present incumbent.

NEW ROADS.

Of the amount of orders drawn for new roads and alterations \$1,174.93 was on account of highways laid out by former boards and consists of land damage awarded for the widening of Mussey street, the extension of and labor and material for the Boulevard, State street ex-

tension and Spruce street extension. The amount which was ordered drawn by the present board was \$9,983.22. Of this amount the largest item was for the extension of Center street through to East street and which necessitated the purchase of the Vail property at a cost of \$6500. All other property owners waived land damage. The buildings on this property were disposed of at auction by the Board. The house was purchased by John W. Cramton for \$250 and the barn was sold to Geo. T. Chaffee for \$160. The amount for which the house was sold is still due from Mr. Cramton.

POOR FARM.

The amount expended for repairs and supplies at Poor farm, other than for support of the poor, has been drawn on the General Fund by Selectmen's orders, though said orders should properly be drawn on account of Overseer of the Poor. The amount of these orders, \$1,253.65, should, therefore, be considered in the sum total expended for support of the poor.

TOWN HALL.

The expenditures on account of the care and maintenance of the Town Hall includes fuel, lighting, expense of janitor and the fitting up of the office for the use of the Overseer of the Poor. The receipts for the use of the hall are much less than the expenditures, as will be seen by reference to the Treasurer's report. The receipts should and would have been greater, but for the fact that the several fire companies, who were voted the use of the hall, insist that its use was to be absolutely free without the usual expense of janitor, lighting and warming, as has been the case heretofore.

MEMORIAL HALL.

The heating apparatus at the Memorial Hall was wholly insufficient. We had it taken out, as instructed by the last annual meeting, and a new system of hot water heating put in at a cost of \$1000. The sum of \$500 has also been expended in fitting up the Memorial Hall room. The building is now for the first time ready to be used for the purposes for which it was erected. It has cost a good deal of money. It is the most expensive soldier's memorial in Vermont, but we believe it is worth all it has cost and that it is, and probably always will be, the most valued public building of the town. It is to be dedicated with appropriate ceremonies next Memorial Day.

PINE STREET TUNNEL.

In 1891 the board of railroad commissioners ordered the construction of a tunnel under the tracks at the foot of Pine street for the extension of said street to Forest street. The cost of this tunnel and bridge was estimated at \$16,298. The Central Vermont Railroad was to do the work and the town to bear one-half of the expense; the work to be completed

on or before the first day of July, 1892. The board of selectmen of that year made the following awards for land damages, which have not been paid.

It was the intention of the present board of selectmen to have this work commenced at once, but were prevented from so doing by the Rutland Railroad appealing from the award made the company for land damages. In August last a committee from the board met the presidents of the above mentioned roads and the matter was adjusted to the satisfaction of all parties. President Clement of the Rutland Railroad agreed to accept \$800 for land damages and withdraw his suit. President Smith of the Central Vermont promised to commence the work at an early day, and here the matter rests.

FOOT BRIDGE.

The town voted over a year ago to build a foot bridge from the foot of Washington street over the railroad tracks to Franklin street and also voted a 10 cent tax to pay for the same. The amount raised by that tax, \$8,258.96, is in the Town treasury. We have been unable to secure from the Central Vermont Railroad company such concessions and agreements as we thought the town ought to have before building an expensive bridge in that place.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Under this caption may be found the amount of orders not otherwise designated, said amount being \$5,010.96.

The Dr. Webb stallion "Incroyable" is being kept at Mr. Smith F. Kelley's place at a cost to the town of \$4 50 per week. The net cost to the town for keeping this horse up to date has been \$146 50.

Notice has been received from the State Treasurer of a State, State School and State Highway tax, which must be provided for the present season.

The State tax is 15 cents on a dollar of the grand list for the year 1893, two-thirds of which is payable into the treasury of the state, on or before the 10th day of November next, and the remaining third on or before the 10th day of the following June.

The State School tax is five cents on the dollar, assessed on the grand list of 1892, and is payable on or before the 1st day of June next.

The State Highway tax of five cents on a dollar is assessed in accordance with section five, No. 56, of the laws of 1892, and payable at the same time as the School tax.

Notice of a County tax of one-quarter cent on the dollar on the list of polls of the inhabitants of the County has been received, and the same is payable to the County treasurer on or before the 1st day of June next.

Overseer's Report.

To the Taxpayers:

During the year ending February 1, 1893, there has been expended for help to poor outside of the Town Farm, \$5,217.97, and for expenses of the farm and care of inmates, \$3,886, making the total expenses, including overseer's salary, \$9,103.97.

There has been received for produce, pasturing, board, etc., and paid to the Town Treasurer, as shown elsewhere, \$371.50, and there is due from other towns and individuals, as shown elsewhere, \$303.07. After applying these credits, the net total expenses of care of poor were \$8,429.40.

Statements and lists appended show in detail to whom the orders have been drawn and the amounts, those helped outside and amounts to each, with the number in family, etc. The inmates at the farm have been more than last year, and more calls for outside assistance. Thirteen have been buried at the expense of the town, of whom five died of diphtheria.

Seven persons have been sent to the insane asylum at the expense of the town, and about 30 more families have been obliged to be helped by the town than was the case last year.

This increase in numbers helped has been caused by the growth and business of the town. In the summer and fall many families have moved from other states and procured work temporarily, but when winter came on their work failed and assistance was sought from the town. The winter has been colder and there have been more idle men that can't find employment, but who would work if they could procure it, than I have ever known before.

Dr. J. D. Hanrahan has continued to be the town physician, and all medicine furnished has been by his express order and prescription.

The last Legislature amended the pauper law according to a bill drawn at my suggestion, by Mr. Dana, by which other towns where paupers have their legal residence will be obliged to support them until they have acquired a new residence after three years. It is hoped that this bill will be of great pecuniary benefit to the town, and already moneys have been collected from other towns, which before the passage of the law they refused to pay.

I have kept, ever since I have been Overseer, an itemized account, in a book kept for the purpose, of all money paid out as poor account. This book, with the original bills, is open at all proper times to inspection.
